# HOW TO PLAY HOLE 12

Par 4 | White Tees: 287 Yards

Hole #12 is quite intriguing. It can keep you up all night thinking about how you double-bogeyed a par 4 that is under 300 yards. Or, you can find yourself boasting to friends that you hit—or almost hit—your tee shot on the green of a par 4 and made easy birdie.

There are several intricacies in playing this short but articulate hole. Either your second shot plays blind from 110 to 150 yards, or you can select to bomb driver, leaving yourself with a chip/pitch of 20 to 50 yards onto a green that slopes both front to back and left to right. Nearly every chip or pitch rolls off the back of the green, and you're left with the thought of par, or even bogey, from 20 yards away after your tee shot. And then there is this: If you hit your tee shot left, the hazard swallows your golf ball, leaving you with a recommended provisional ball from the tee. If it is a lost ball, the third shot was from the teeing ground, now heading toward the antagonizing double bogey.

#### Helpful Hints for Playing Hole #12

- From tee box (white tees) to top of hill is 187 yards.
- Top of the hill from the fairway is 100 yards to the green.
- If you have a blind second shot, your target is the lone high tree in the background.
- For shorter hitters, since the green slopes front to back and the hole slopes left to right, hit one or two clubs less, aligning yourself to the left half of the green. Play not to hit the green, but to land on the front bank and roll the ball on.

Hole #12 can be a bit easier in soft conditions. If there is a dry spell, good luck hitting your approach on the green. A high-trajectory, full-wedge shot is about the only chance you have to keep it on.

If you are confident with your driver and your short game is on, I say go for it every time and get out of there with a decent birdie chance (par at worst). But, if your feel around the green is a bit more inconsistent, or you do not drive the ball 230 plus, a hybrid or 4/5 iron that goes 175 to 190 yards off the tee will leave you approximately 100 yards into the green. Then, all you have left is a simple, full, high-lofted shot, or a bump and run left of the flag and let it roll on.

Hope you find these tips on hole #12 useful. Good luck!





#### Favorite hole at Meadia Heights?


I have a love/hate relationship with hole #3.


Members of Meadia Heights will recognize

but did you know the following facts about him?










- Jeff was born in Chicago, Illinois, then moved to Landisville when he was about 12 years old. He's a 1982 graduate of Hempfield High School.

#### **HOLE IN ONE FAST FACTS**

#### The Odds on Making a Hole in One

- Pro Golfer = 2,500 to 1
- Low-Handicap Amateur = 5,000 to 1
- Average Amateur = 12,500 to 1

#### 2 for 1!

Gene Sarazen and David Russell both made a hole in one during the 1973 Open Championship in Troon, Scotland.

#### How About 4 for 1!

Nick Price, Doug Weaver, Jerry Pate, and Mark Wiebe all made hole in ones on the 6th hole during the 1989 US Open at the Oak Hill Country Club. The odds of this happening, even at the professional level, are staggering—1.6 million to 1!

#### Hole in One Trivia

The most recorded hole in ones by a professional golfer is 51, by Mancil Davis. Eight of those came in a single year.

The odds of having two hole in ones in a single round by an amateur golfer are 67 million to 1!

The average handicap of an amateur golfer who makes a hole in one is 14.

40% of all hole in ones are made with a 7. 8. or 9 iron.

60% of all hole in ones recorded each year are made by golfers age 50 or older.
