

FEATURED DRINK

As the leaves change color and a chill creeps into the air, the flavors of apple and spice just seem right. This Autumn Bourbon Fizz is a wonderful, warming cocktail after a round of golf, on your Thanksgiving table, or for relaxing in front of a fire.

Ingredients

For the Rim

- Orange wedge
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1 TB sugar

For the Drink

- 2 oz Maker's Mark
- 4 to 6 oz ginger ale
- 3 TB apple butter
- Pinch of cinnamon

Instructions

- 1. Rim your glass with an orange wedge.
- 2. Combine the cinnamon and sugar on a plate.
- 3. Dip the rim of your glass in the cinnamon sugar to coat.
- 4. Fill a shaker with ice.
- 5. Add the apple butter, Maker's Mark, and a pinch of cinnamon.
- 6. Shake well for 30 seconds.
- 7. Pour the mixture into your glass.
- 8. Top off with ginger ale. For a spicier kick, use ginger beer instead!

Favorite golf memory? Playing in Pinehurst for my 60th birthday weekend with all my buds!



POSTARE

Separate the upper body from the lower body by hinging from the hips, feeling as though you are getting ready to sit in a chair. Tilt your spine angle over the ball and check off this list:

Feet are shoulder-width apart

Toes are equal distance from the ball

Knees are flexed for versatility and effective turn

Hands and arms are relaxed

BACKSWING

The tempo of the backswing should be slow and smooth. The backswing is designed to load the energy, thus taking the club back low and slow.

DOWNSWING

Transitioning the backswing into the downswing begins with a turn of the back foot and your hands leading the clubhead. I always like to say, "Swing with your back foot," which helps bring your hands more forward and keeps the clubhead from coming down too early.

The downswing is an accelerated motion allowing all of your momentum to take you to a full finish. It is important to note that the posture must be maintained, especially through impact, for maximum distance and accuracy.

FINISH

Hold your pose, allowing the momentum you created to finish on your front side. Ideally your belt buckle faces the target, or even left of your target, which solidifies that you have produced a full swing.
