TURF TALK

As I write this, summer is on its way! The maintenance department had a successful spring, and hopefully by the time you read this, our summer projects will be either complete or in progress.

Before the start of the season, our crew wrapped up some leftover winter projects and made improvements throughout the course. Bunkers were edged to a soil base instead of half sand, half soil, which will help the grass retain moisture better and be lusher in the future.

On the subject of lush turf, we sprayed pre-emergent herbicides to help control crab and goosegrass. By eradicating these weeds, we can stop the seeds from spreading as we mow rough and blow debris. The weeds won't be able to steal nutrients from the grasses we want to keep, resulting in healthier turf.

Our next project is cart paths! We have three rolls of track mat ready to be put at the cart paths' transitions. The cart path at 6 green is where we plan to start, considering it the largest area to address — we'll start with the worst and just keep going!

The team is also working on the best way to tackle another exciting project: cleaning out the pond in front of 18 green. Light can penetrate water to a five-foot depth, allowing many unwanted plants to grow in that water source. Making the pond deeper will minimize the weed and algae growth.

Summer is a super fun time to manage turf (a little sarcasm there). Our main goal is keeping it healthy despite the heat and heavy use. You may notice our crew slowing down on other projects to perform turf maintenance, including hand watering, keeping divots filled, and maintaining the irrigation system. This spring, we trained and prepped new employees who are up to the task — including Maggie, our Chief Goose Chaser!

Recent Ruling at Meadia Heights

Did You Know...?

Rule 18.3c

Playing Provisional Ball Until It Becomes the Ball in Play or Is Abandoned

If a player is unsure if their tee shot goes out of bounds, they are allowed to play a provisional ball. They may continue to play it as provisional if they are certain it is the same distance or farther from the hole than the original ball. This is true even if the provisional ball is played several times.

The provisional ball becomes the ball in play, under penalty of stroke and distance, if:

The original ball is out of bounds or it is lost on the course anywhere but a penalty area.

OR
|

The provisional ball is played from a spot closer to the hole than where the original ball is estimated to be.

This ruling came up during a GAP match a few years ago, but was unknown to some of us — just proving that there is always something to learn about golf!

Do Your Part!

We take pride in our course, and we hope you do too. Visitors often comment on the great shape it's in — please help us keep it that way! Repairing your divots and ball marks is not only good etiquette, it helps maintain an optimal playing surface for everyone.

HOW TO FIX A DIVOT

A divot is the piece of sod that's displaced when you strike the fairway with your club head. If repaired correctly, the sod should take root and continue to grow.



1

Oops! Divots happen to the best of us.



2

Place the divot back into the divot hole.



3

Step down on the divot and the edges firmly.



4

Pour divot mix around the edges.



5

Step down on the divot mix to smooth it out.



HOW TO FIX A BALL MARK

A ball mark is the indentation that's made when a ball hits the green. Left unrepaired, ball marks create an uneven putting surface (and just look bad!).



1

Thwack! Your ball has made its mark.

2

Insert a tee or divot tool behind the mark at a 45° angle.*

3

Pull it toward the mark's center, gently moving the turf to fill in the indentation.

4

Repeat, going around the entire ball mark.

5

Tap the mark with a putter to even it out.

*The “back” of a ball mark = the side all the turf has been pushed to.

BE OUR GUEST!

At Meadia Heights, we hold our club in high regard, ensuring each member embodies the spirit of the game and respects the longstanding standards of the sport. While the following guidance is intended for the guests you invite to play golf, many are good reminders for all of us!

GUESTS OF MEADIA HEIGHTS:

- Should arrive early, wearing proper golf attire (see below).
- Can either leave their bag at the bag drop or carry it around to the golf cart staging area.
- May use the locker rooms to change into their golf shoes (soft spikes only).
- Should check in at the golf shop before teeing off on the first hole.
- May access the driving range, with golf balls provided there.
- Are expected to treat the golf course as if they are a member and fill divots in fairways and repair ball marks on greens.
- Should keep a pace of play of 4 hours and 15 minutes or less per round.
- May pay cash or credit for merchandise in the golf shop. All food and beverage purchases must go through a member's account.

WHAT IS PROPER GOLF ATTIRE?

For both men and women, appropriate attire includes shirts with collars and neat pants or shorts.

Mock turtleneck shirts are acceptable for men. Fashion sleeveless tops for women must have a collar, although fashion sleeved tops without a collar may be worn. Gym shorts, cargo pants or shorts, sweatpants, warm-up suits, T-shirts, and tank tops are not permitted, as well as any clothing that is worn, torn, baggy, or has holes.

HOW TO CATCH A SANDBAGGER

We’ve all heard the term. Sometimes it’s thrown around as a friendly dig at someone who just shot a great round and took you for \$20. Other times it’s an angry insult at a player who consistently shoots 83 in a tournament and has an 18 handicap. Everyone catches lightning in a bottle once a summer, but beating or shooting your handicap on a regular basis deserves greater scrutiny!

So how can you tell if someone just happened to shoot their career round or if they’re one of those unscrupulous golfers who cheats the system in order to win?

First, let’s revisit the handicap system. Your handicap is based on your **BEST** potential score for 18 holes. It is **NOT** your average score. Say par is 72 and your handicap is 14. You should not be shooting an 86 in half the rounds you play. You should shoot your handicap in only one out of every four rounds. The other three should be in the high 80s or low 90s.

How does someone cheat the system? Most commonly by inflating their handicap. They enter their high scores, but never their low scores, into the GHIN or other handicap tracking system — a clear violation.

The chart below shows the probability of shooting an exceptional tournament score based on a given handicap. Say a player with a handicap index of 10.5 shoots a 74 from a set of tees with a USGA course rating of 71.2 and a slope rating of 126. Their net differential is -8 (their course handicap based on their index — the GHIN app does this math for you).

As you can see, the odds of shooting a 74 for a NET 66 are 4,467 to 1. If they shoot a similar score twice — you are definitely in the presence of a sandbagger!

In the final round, he shot a 69 to tie for third place and win \$385 — allowing him to put new wheels on his car and continue playing golf. After the Oakland Open, the now famous Hogan began winning with regularity.

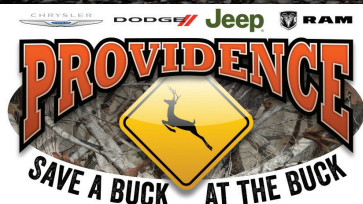
