

Apple Cider Margarita

Ingredients

- 2 oz silver tequila
- ½ oz orange liqueur
- 4 oz apple cider
- Juice of 1/2 a lime
- 2 tsp maple syrup (or to taste)
- Ice
- Apple slice and cinnamon stick for garnish

Optional: cinnamon sugar, sea salt

Instructions

- 1. Optional (but delicious): Rim glass in salted cinnamon sugar. Mix equal parts cinnamon sugar and sea salt. Run a lime wedge around the rim of the glass, and dip it in the sugar mixture to coat.
- 2. Combine tequila, orange liqueur, apple cider, lime juice, and maple syrup in a cocktail shaker.
- 3. Add ice, and shake to combine. Add ice to the glass as well.
- 4. Strain shaker contents into the glass.
- 5. Garnish with an apple slice and cinnamon stick.

Toast to fall with this autumnal interpretation of the classic tequila drink. With cozy flavors of apple, maple, and cinnamon, this sweet and spicy cocktail is sure to warm your spirit as the weather gets cooler.

TIURE TRAILS By Ryan Grady, Golf Course Superintendent

Well, another summer is in the books, and to be honest, it's not the summer I had hoped for. The record-setting drought Lancaster experienced in early spring didn't help the *Poa annua* on our fairways during the summer stress months. But we are proactively addressing the issue! Maintenance has started reseeding the poor areas with bentgrass. This isn't just any old bentgrass either — it's SUPER BENTS! Basically, turf breeders took the best grasses and crossbred them. These cultivars have better stress and wear tolerance than *Poa annua*, as well as resistance to dollar spot. The crew and I will have these areas improved before things go dormant this winter.

Although some fairways struggled this summer, there were still positives on the course. The first cycle of weed control was very successful, with the populations of weeds like goosegrass and crabgrass decreasing dramatically. The elimination of white clover will require a few more applications. Patchy areas have decreased in size, and bentgrass has filled in nicely. Our crew sodded the sand trap edges, eliminated bunker tongues, and added track mat to over half of the cart paths, a project we will finish before next spring. Maggie also learned a new trick: "Say please."

Over the off-season, tree work will be a priority (over the next several off-seasons to be honest). Whether it's whole trees or just branches, the chain saws will be busy. Bunker drainage is also high on the to-do list, as well as doing more edge work and adding sand to some of the bunkers. We also plan to address the walking path on 4/13 tee and expose the rocks coming out of the hillside.

The crew and I have many other ideas for the course, which we will prioritize and put into action. As a team, we will continue to work hard to make the course better!

RULES

You're probably pretty savvy about the Rules of Golf, but how well do you know Meadia Heights' Local Rules? Here's how to handle some of the areas of our course that might leave you scratching your head.



Immovable Obstructions

If a player's lie, stance, or swing is affected by electrical boxes or by the telephone poles on the right side of hole #10, they may take free relief by dropping at the nearest point, no closer to the hole.



Wooden Walls of Bunkers

Players may take free relief, no closer to the hole, for any lie, stance, or swing *outside of the bunker* affected by wooden bunker supports. Players may not take relief for lies *within the bunker* affected by wooden bunker supports.



Ground Under Repair

All areas encircled by a white line are deemed to be ground under repair. Players may take free relief by dropping at the nearest point, no closer to the hole.



Flower Beds / Mulched Areas

All mulched flower beds, including any mulched area not located in a penalty area or out of bounds, are deemed ground under repair and considered a no-play zone. Players **must** take relief — at the nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole — with no penalty.



Internal Wooded Areas

All internal wooded areas are considered in play and **not** a penalty area. These areas include:

- Left of #4
- Behind #13
- Left of #12
- Left of #15

If a player hits a ball that enters these areas and they cannot find it, they should hit a provisional ball.



Penalty Areas

The yellow penalty area on the right side of hole #18 extends to, and coincides with, the out-of-bounds edge directly after the creek.

What's something people might be surprised to learn about you?


I have an artistic mind and am very creative.

Don't Be *That* Guy (or Gal)

Meadia Heights Rules to Keep Things Fun for Everyone

Entering the Parking Lot

• Enter the parking lot through the correct entrance. Do not enter from the exit-only side.

Bringing Guests

- If you have a guest, check into the golf shop and let us know how you would like to pay for them.
- Make sure your guest is wearing the proper golf attire shirt tucked in, hat the correct way.
- Weekend Rules
 - 1 guest per foursome before 10:00 am on Saturdays.
 - 2 guests per foursome before 10:00 am on Sundays.

Driving Golf Carts

• On the par 3s, drive on the cart path only. The golf staff has noticed several members driving on these holes, and it is not allowed.

For the next three items, I want to distinguish between a competitive round and a casual one. Players absolutely cannot do these things in competitive play. But even in casual play, they are bad habits to get into, and they are strongly discouraged by the golf staff.

Fluffing Your Lie in the Rough (Or Anywhere on the Course)

- Fluffing your lie should really never be done. The golf staff is most concerned about it in tournament play, but also in any event or game where money is on the line, including sweeps games.
- If you see someone fluffing their lie in an event, please tell that person and/or report it to the golf shop staff.
- Never fluff your lie when you are posting a round.
- It is a two-stroke penalty if your ball at rest is moved, and it must be replaced.

Giving or Picking Up Putts

- The only format you are allowed to pick up putts is match play.
- In casual rounds, it is okay to give a short putt, but highly discouraged.
- In any stroke play event that we post scores for you, whether it's a tournament or sweeps game, all putts must be holed out. The golf staff will start being stricter about this.

Posting Scores Inaccurately

- Playing your best at all times is how the game should be played.
- A Handicap Committee will be formed at the end of 2023 to ensure stricter practices at Meadia Heights.
