

All of them would have been in a book called *What If?: Serious Scientific Answers to Absurd Hypothetical Questions.*


Who is someone you look up to? Why?

COURSE MANAGEMENT

Course management is the approach you take to make better oncourse decisions that fit best with your playing style. It's knowing which clubs to use, which shots to take, and when to play to your strengths. Here are a few tips to consider next time you hit the links.

Have a "go-to" longer club in your bag. A comfortable club you can rely on consistently will build your confidence throughout the round.

Play the percentages into the green. By aiming for the larger part of the green, you are more likely to still be on it should you miss the ball.

Practice distance control in putting. This is vital to becoming a successful golfer. If you struggle with distance control, calibrating your putting and associating a stroke size with a distance can be helpful.

Respect the downhill. A good goal for downhill putts is just to get the ball close or a percentage of the way. Gravity will take care of a lot of the distance on its own.

Smaller strokes around the green mean less chance for error. By extension, smaller strokes equal smaller mistakes.

Option 1: Putt.

Option 2: Chip when you cannot putt.

Option 3: Pitch or lob only when you have to.

If you chip with the right club, and you do not quite brush the grass, the ball should still find the green in most cases.

Be aware of "no-go zones."
Strategizing your shot
accordingly (say, hitting shorter
than usual to avoid landing in
a bunker) can help you lessen
the chance of penalties.


Ride your good streaks. There are times when we feel like we "have it" — and times when we don't. React to this. When you're on, be aggressive and try to drive your score lower. This may be the time you aim right at the pin or try to carry a hazard that you would normally play around. The reverse is true too. If you're not playing your best, choose less aggressive clubs or ways around the course to regain confidence and get going again. Good golfers make adjustments throughout their rounds all the time.


Member Survey Results



TURF TALK

Ryan Grady, Golf Course Superintendent

irst of all, I wanted to say thanks to the members and staff for making me feel welcome here. Everyone made me feel right at home. I'm super excited to be here and can't wait for all the great things to come at Meadia Heights.

TIMBER!!! With the mild winter, we were able to do some major tree work. We hired a company to remove the massive dead trees throughout the course and remove low-hanging branches as well. Our staff was also busy with tree work and removing debris. These updates will improve the safety and sight lines throughout the course. We made a dent this off-season and will continue to make progress as we prepare for the 2023 season.

You'll notice number 4 and 13 tee boxes started to get a makeover. Staff built the two decorative log walls from trees we cut down on the course. Old blacktop was removed, and soil was graded. Red stone was brought in to finish the pad for the new beverage cart. As for the tee boxes themselves, we are going to strip the old turf and start fresh with new sod. We will also do the same to the senior tee at hole 7.

A small sod farm will be laid on the property. This will allow us to replace worn-out areas on tees and fairways quickly. In the fall, we slit seeded and fertilized the rough and tee to fairway areas. To improve our rough, a nutritional plan will be included in the maintenance program this year.

Track mats were installed recently to provide a smooth transition from the paved cart paths to grass. These mats will enable grass to grow even at such a high-traffic area. After a successful trial run, we will be adding more.

I am looking forward to a great 2023 season. I'll see you on the greens.

As our membership grows, we want to maintain a high level of etiquette throughout the course. Here are four ways the staff and membership can work together to ensure an exceptional experience for everyone.



Sand Mix - Repairing Divots in the Fairways

We provide sand mix in our golf carts, and we ask that if you see a divot that has not been replaced, please fill it.



On the Green - Repairing Ball Marks

If you hit a shot and your ball lands on the green, please get into the habit of locating that ball mark and fixing it before you hit your putt.



Pace of Play - Keeping It at 4 Hours or Less

Our staff will do their best to control the daily pace of play. Foursomes have a priority on the course. If you are a single, twosome, or threesome, as long as you play in a 2-hour, 9-hole time frame, that is acceptable. If you are falling behind, work to catch up to the group in front of you.



Golf Carts - Staying on the Path

We prefer that golfers drive golf carts on the fairway as opposed to the rough. This will help the rough last longer throughout the season. Par 3 holes are always Cart Path Only. On hole 18, if you hit your ball to the left, we expect you to stay on the cart path and walk over to your ball.
