

I am also delighted to introduce two new team members who have already made a significant impact. He has been instrumental in maintaining the pristine condition of our course by picking up trash, wiping down hole signs, and straightening the tee markers and stakes. This year, we introduced our new point-of-sale system, Club Caddie. While it has brought several improvements, such as a mobile app where you can view just about everything you need, it has come with some challenges as well. 

Welcome to **Summer 2024!**

Maybe it's me, but it feels like this season has been flying by. Seems like we were just bundled up doing winter work.

Spring 2024 was much better than years past, as we didn't break any records for lack of rainfall. It was also the first time in my career (not just at Meadia) that we didn't have to run an ad for employment. Our team was able to get the root pruning around the fairways and greens done, and I believe the fairways already look healthier and show fewer signs of drought stress we just had a dry spell, and there were fewer localized dry spots. We also did a lot of irrigation repairs this spring, and all the in-play areas now have working irrigation. Sounds great, right? I think so.

This season, we are doing test trials with different growth regulators on the number 17 fairway. We are trying to find a happy medium where the poa annual doesn't yellow out so much but is not more aggressive than the bentgrass. You will notice a few boxes that appear different in color. We are not trying to remove any poa chemically, just find the perfect mix that suits our course. My inner nerd is pretty excited to do these tests.

You have probably noticed some playing areas around the greens have patches of taller and shorter grasses. As we apply growth regulator to our greens to keep them consistent throughout the season, it also hits parts of the rough, causing these patches. We have resodded and reseeded these areas, and will continue to do so, to drive out the unwanted grasses so putting is more consistent.

That's about it for this issue of Bump & Run. We are super excited for this season and hope everyone has a fantastic summer here at Meadia. Maggie also says hello and will be out on the course more to say it herself.

At Meadia Heights, we're proud of our course, and we hope you are too. Everyone can do their part to keep it looking — and playing — great by fixing their divots and repairing their ball marks. But what's the best way to do it? Read on.

HOW TO FIX A DIVOT

A divot is the piece of sod that's displaced when you strike the fairway with your club head. By repairing it, the sod should take root again and continue to grow.











%*#@! Divots happen to the best of us.

Place the divot back into the divot hole.

Step down on the divot Pour a small amount of Step down on the divot and its edges firmly. divot mix around the edges. mix to smooth it out.

HOW TO FIX A BALL MARK

A ball mark is the indentation that's made when a ball hits the green. Ball marks create an uneven putting surface if left unrepaired.



Thunk! Your ball has made its mark.

Insert a tee or divot tool behind the ball mark at a 45° angle.*

Pull it toward the mark's center, gently moving the turf to fill in the indentation.

Repeat, going around the entire ball mark.

Tap the mark with a putter to even it out.

You and your guest should arrive at Meadia at least 15 minutes before your tee time so you can check in, stretch, and prepare.



Enjoy the Day

Be kind and courteous to other golfers while maintaining a 4-hour round of golf, follow golf cart rules, and enjoy our beautiful grounds. And be sure to stop at the 19th Hole afterward to toast your companion and introduce them to your fellow members!

Look Sharp!



Men

- Shirts with collars or mock turtlenecks.
- Neat pants or Bermuda shorts (no higher than 3" from the top of the knee), belts encouraged.
- Golf hats must be worn with the brim facing forward.

Women

- Shirts with collars (sleeved golf/polo tops may be collarless).
- Neat pants, capris, shorts (inseam should be at least 5" in length), or skorts, as long as they are not denim.

All golfers must wear golf shoes with soft spikes only.


Inappropriate Attire for Men & Women:

Blue denim jeans, cargo pants/shorts, athletic/gym shorts, sweatpants, warm-up suits, T-shirts, tank tops, and clothing that is worn, torn, baggy, ripped, or has holes.

Note on Clubhouse Attire:

Golf course attire guidelines also apply to the clubhouse, with two exceptions — neat, suitable jeans are permitted, and sports team attire is permitted at relevant times.

At the discretion of the golf professional staff, anyone wearing inappropriate attire will not be permitted on the golf course.


The scoring was intense, as many flight winners were decided by only a few points. And adding to the drama this year:

Don't Put Your Cart **Before the Course**

As your "Home Away From Home," Meadia Heights prides itself on its course upkeep, with our outstanding grounds crew ensuring the club's entire property remains pristine at all times. But, just as at home, we all have responsibilities in keeping the place tidy.


The easiest way for us, as players and club members, to help our crew maintain a beautiful course is to make sure we keep our golf carts on the designated paths as often as possible. Fewer tracks across fairways and through the rough makes for more uniform, fair play for all — and fewer headaches for Golf Course Superintendent Ryan Grady.

HERE ARE SOME QUICK TIPS ON GOLF CART ETIOUETTE FOR US ALL TO FOLLOW:

- 1. Follow all cart sign directions.
- 2. Utilize cart paths wherever and whenever possible, ensuring all four tires are completely on the cart path.
- 3. Do not drive on the tee, green, in bunkers, or restricted areas.
- 4. Stay clear of the greens and surrounding areas to preserve course conditions.

Please note: golfers who qualify for a handicap flag may be allowed to access restricted areas around greens and bunkers, and drive on fairways, as needed. A handicap flag will be added to the cart to identify these golfers. Restrictions still apply to handicap-flagged carts, including:

- Carts must stay on paths when parked at tees.
- · Carts may not be driven into roped areas.
- Carts may not be driven into nonirrigated areas.
- Able-bodied golfers riding with a disabled golfer must walk to their ball when it's in an off-limits area.
- If more than one disabled person is in the group, they must ride together.

The Queen of Starts


