Playing Augusta National would be a bucket list item because I would want to see how I would putt those greens.


Which is your favorite hole at Meadia Heights?

Turf Mats

Turf mats will again be issued to golfers from November until March (weather dependent) to protect tee boxes and fairways from divots to ensure playability into spring and beyond. Mats are to be used at all times from the fairways and tee boxes, unless using a driver. They are not required for shots hit from the rough.

To play from the mat, place it in line lengthwise with how your clubhead will travel. The grass beneath, and our investment in that grass, will be protected. Winter tees, which can be placed directly on the mat, will be available for purchase in the golf shop.



Temporary Greens

In January and February, temporary greens will be implemented to prevent damage to our normal greens.

Cart Use

Carts will be available throughout the winter. However, on nicer days when the ground has thawed, we will prohibit their use. Why? When winter days turn warm, the surface of the ground begins to thaw and soften while the layers beneath remain frozen. Driving carts in these conditions damages the turf, tearing its root systems and leaving deep ruts in the ground.



Cart Cover Programs

From November to February, we're offering two options for cart cover use.

OPTION 1 | \$50/MO Ideal for Members Who Play a Lot of Winter Golf

We'll install your cart cover, then keep it here and rotate it to a different cart each month (to help keep our fleet strong). On March 1, we'll remove your cover and carefully store all of your winter belongings for the year. This is a 4-month program and cannot be utilized month to month.

OPTION 2 | FREE For Members Who Play Only Periodically in Winter

Bring your cart cover to the course on the day you play, and we'll help install it before your round, then remove it afterward for you to take with you. Cart covers may not be stored in the locker room or bag room.

Q: WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO YOUR YOUNGER SELF?



Fall is officially here! After a warm start, we've had a few frosts, leaves have been falling, and we're switching gears into cleanup mode. Mowing has slowed down, and our leaf blowers have been busier than normal. As we get caught up with the leaves, we'll start getting into some projects that will take us into and through the off-season.



Seeding Update

In October, Hummer Turfgrass reseeded our fairways, which was covered by the Susquehanna River Basin Commission (SRBC) grant we received. We used the same grass seed that is in our divot mix, regenerating perennial ryegrass (RPR), which has great color, needs fewer inputs, and holds up well to traffic. Our fairways were resilient this year, and this seed should continue to help shoulder the burden of play for years to come.

The bulk of the SRBC grant was used to upgrade our irrigation system. The George E. Ley Company replaced our 25-year-old Rainbird sprinklers with new Toro Infinity sprinklers, and they upgraded our office computer system and installed new satellite stations in the field. As we all know, technology has come a long way in the past 25 years, and the turf world is no different. With this new system and Toro software, we'll be able to use an app that has all our sprinkler heads mapped on it via Google Earth. This will allow us to, among other things, turn on only select heads (instead of all of them), which will greatly reduce the amount of water we apply on a normal summer day.



Sod Improvements

Among the projects planned for the off-season, we'll continue to pick away at some small sod jobs we started in the spring. These will mostly include cart path ends and fixing some bunker edges that deteriorated over the season.

We plan to knock out two improvements at once: replacing the wooden face bunkers with stacked sod and adding target greens to the driving range. First, we'll sod cut circular targets around the existing posts at the range — this is the sod we'll stack on bunker edges. In the soil circles left around the posts, we'll then fill in plugs from greens and tee aerification. With some water, fertilizer, and possibly a touch of seed, we'll have the same grass type on these target greens as we do on greens and tees. We plan to cut them at tee height next season, so from the range tee, you'll see dark green rough with light green target greens. Ideally, this will give all of you practicing on the range a chance to really dial in your irons and wedges.



Tee Work

Another project will be reshaping some undersized tees and re-leveling others. The #1 tee will have the tee sod removed and put off to the side. We'll then reshape the surface, level it out, and put the sod back to create a nicely shaped, level tee. To help accommodate playing demand, we'll also be enlarging the forward tees on #6, #14, and #18. Larger tees allow us to use many different areas and disperse traffic regularly. I'm sure you noticed that our larger tees performed well with traffic this season, mostly because we moved tee markers daily.

We'll also be adding a forward tee to #16 for silver and gold tee players, about halfway up the hill on the left-hand side of the fairway, almost dead center from the cart path. This will give gold tee players a better chance to hit drives onto the fairway. It's still going to be a difficult uphill shot, but it won't be nearly as challenging.



Rough Height

I have to say, you all were very vocal about the rough this year! We had been cutting it at 3", both for turf health and to enhance mowing lines with the new step cut. However, after hearing your concerns, and playing it myself and experiencing how thick it is, we've decided to lower it.

For context, the rough height had been 2.5", with the step cut 1.75". The step cut wasn't very visible, so we made it 1.5", which was still hard to see. We didn't want to take the step cut any lower for fear of scalping it before it was ready — we needed to have decent roots before we did anything drastic. So, we took the rough up half an inch. After a year at these heights and with the working fertigation system, we believe we can now change it up. We'll probably land somewhere around a 1.25" step cut and a 2.75" rough, which will hopefully achieve the look we're going for while also giving us HEALTHY turf. After all, that was our main goal for this year.



Tree Work

Some of the bigger jobs planned this fall and winter include selective tree removal. We made a list over the summer of trees whose health is declining. There aren't many, but definitely a handful that are only going to get worse. We're also going to target the #14 fairway. After seeing how well #3 fairway performed after selective removal of pines on its right side, we're planning to do something similar to the left side of #14. Our goal is not to change the shape or playability of the hole, but to give the left-side rough and fairway more needed sunlight.



Weathering the Season

This year has been challenging for everyone in the turf industry across the region. We saw a record-breaking wet spring and early summer, followed by a sharp drop in humidity and prolonged dry periods from midsummer to early fall. All that considered, I'm incredibly impressed with how we've fared! Our fungicide and insecticide program held up to some extremely high demands, and our crew has been steadfast throughout the changing environments we've faced.

I'm incredibly lucky and proud to have such a strong crew and a great assistant, all of whom meet any challenge head-on. As we move into the off-season, we have a long list of things we want to do, and as long as Mother Nature is kind to us, there's a high likelihood we'll get it all done. I'm confident the changes will be overwhelmingly good, and I'm excited for all of you to experience them in the spring!

WHAT'S SOMETHING YOU'RE GRATEFUL FOR?


My family. I have an awesome daughter and son-in-law who have blessed me with four wonderful grandchildren. And of course, my husband, Dick.
